An article “Dayana Yastremska accused of attempted cover-up over doping allegations” (May, 14) reported on allegations that the professional tennis player Dayana Yastremska and her father Oleksandr Yastremskyy had engaged in an attempted cover up after she tested positive. In June 2021, the Independent Tribunal of the International Tennis Federation, as we reported at the time, found after a full hearing, that whilst Ms Yastremska returned a positive doping control test in December 2020 due to a contamination event, this had not been caused by any fault, negligence, or wrongdoing on Ms Yastremska's part in consequence of which no sanction was imposed on her. We accept and are happy to make clear that, as the Tribunal found, neither Ms Yastremska nor her father were engaged in any cover up. We apologise to Ms Yastremska and her father and have agreed to pay them damages for the distress and damage to their reputations caused by our article.
